

Learning for Life: Volunteer Tutors



Did you know?

- Around a quarter of the Scottish adult population face occasional challenges with their literacy
- One person in every 28 in Scotland faces serious problems with their literacy
- This means that over 8,000 people in Highland may face difficulties with literacy which affects their daily living and limits their potential

What we do:

High Life Highland's Adult Learning service provides free, confidential tuition on a one-to-one or small group basis. It helps people improve their literacy, numeracy and information literacy skills, and encourages personal confidence and lifelong learning. This includes working with people who speak English as an additional language.

Would you be interested in becoming a volunteer tutor?

High Life Highland offers a training course for people interested in becoming volunteer tutors. This course is accredited by the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) and is nationally recognised.
