ADULT LEARNING IN CAITHNESS October 2017

NOSS PRIMARY INTERGENERATIONAL PROJECT



In partnership with the Caithness HLH Adult Learning Co-ordinator and the local GWT co-ordinator, Noss Primary school in Wick hosted grandparents and older family members over two afternoons where they engaged in question and answer sessions with primary 3 / 4 and two p7 classes.

This was set up to celebrate Family Learning Week (2-9 Sept) and incorporate Grandparents Day (10 Sept) and International Day of Older Persons (1 Oct).

Pupils were asked to collect old photos from an older family member and do a piece of writing around the photo.





The overall aim was to challenge stereotypes about age and to highlight the help and support our grandparents provide us. We wanted to increase awareness in the children of age differences and encourage viewing grandparents as individuals.

Some of the expected outcomes were:

- More intentions to spend time with older adults
- More knowledge about ageing
- Improved attitudes towards older adults
