Key facts and stats

The Dingwall Youth Team worked with over 160 young people between 11 and 21 amounting to 1237 meaningful contacts.

In total there were approx. 3197 hours of engagement with young people.

These were delivered on 255 separate occasions.

And took place in Dingwall, , Strathpeffer, Dingwall Leisure Centre, Sabhal Mor Ostaig, residentials, trips away.....

A total of 56 recognised awards were gained

DINGWALL YOUTH FORUM

The Dingwall ASG Youth Forum continues to be a successful group. The group are responsible for all the planning, advertising and some of the delivery of the FUSION events. The young people within the forum are consistently consulting with their peers to ensure that the FUSION events are popular. The Forum also supports other community events such as the Dingwall Academy Spring Fair, Dingwall Primary So Long Summer Event and Dingwall Gala Week.

SOCIAL SKILLS GROUP

Following on from the successful Highlights groups the Youth Development team were approached by Dingwall Academy to work with a group of young people with additional needs. In partnership with Highland Council's Social Work Disability team a programme was developed to work with a group of young people on issues which affect them. The group will also be working towards a Dynamic Youth Award and SALTIRE award.

LEADERSHIP

The Youth Development team in partnership with Active Schools have delivered the Go Lead Sports Leadership Award to 45 young people in the Dingwall ASG. The majority of young people then volunteered to support the P7 Transition project. Without the help of the leaders the P7 Transition project would not have been able to take place! Several leaders then volunteered to help at the Dingwall Leisure Centre Summer Play scheme.
