Key facts and stats

The youth team has worked with over 52 young people between March 2016 and October 2016, amounting to 1224 meaningful contacts.

In total there were approximately 744 hours of engagement with young people

These occurred on 35 occasions and were delivered in and around the Great Glen

Fort Augustus Youth Club

After the village hall was taken over by the community and remodelled it has become a much more user friendly space for a variety of local groups to use, and with an increased number of young people in the area we hope his club will continue to grow in popularity for the young people to enjoy. The attendees are coming from an increasingly wider area and seem to enjoy the atmosphere at this established club. This interaction from a wider area brings a great sense of community and cohesion.

We continue to run the youth club on two nights a week as this seems to fit with the demand of the young people.
