### Key facts and stats

Between April 2016 to September 2016 the Grantown area youth team engaged with over 78 young people aged between 11 and 21 amounting to nearly 600 meaningful contacts.

In total there were around 600 hours of engagement with young people.

These were delivered on over 70 separate occasions.

They took place primarily in the Craig MacLean Centre, Grantown Grammar School and Grantown YMCA.

3 recognised awards were gained

## THE STORIES: THE DIFFERENCES: THE FUTURE

#### **COOKING GROUP**

Pupils from Grantown Grammar participated in a cooking group in The Hub in partnership with the Calman Trust which helped them to learn about different recipes and how to prepare and cook different meals. This was beneficial not only for building confidence but also helped to develop independent living skills.

#### **FUSION EVENTS**

Fusion evenings were run in both Grantown YMCA and the Craig Maclean Centre in Grantown. Activities included bubble football and Lazertag. Events were well attended and gave an opportunity for youth workers to make new contact with the young people. Evaluation was encouraging as the young people stated that they had thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

#### **WORK IN SCHOOLS**

The youth work team has recently been working in Grantown Grammar School. The majority of the engagement has been working with the learning support and guidance teams. This has included 1 to 1 work in learning support and working with S2 boys around mental health.
