Key facts and stats

The youth team worked with 81 young people over the past 6 months plus additional groups and individuals on an occasional basis and in supporting partner organisations. Number of meaningful contacts amounted to 2148.

In total there were at least 2957 hours of engagement with young people

These were delivered on 166 occasions

Activities took place in Nairn Youth Café and Nairn Academy

8 young people signed up under the HLH Leadership programme gaining 400 hours of SALTIRE awards and 10 training course certificates.

NAIRN YOUTH CAFÉ

Delivered by a team of youth workers on 2 nights a week: Wednesdays for S1 and HLH Young Leaders: Fridays for S2 and above. Young people enjoy socialising and have the opportunity to access and self-direct a range of activities and information in a nurtured environment. They develop life skills, and enjoy trying new things.

NAIRN YOUTH FORUM

Meets weekly during term time. following the success of their Positive Corner's mural project, current priorities include recruitment of younger member's to pass on skills and sustain a strong youth voice in Nairn.

The 16+ project targeting young people preparing to make the transition from school to a positive destination will draw on a new Education/Chamber of Commerce partnership project "Developing Our Young Workforce".



HOW'S THE FUTURE LOOKING?

- Getting On achievements through learning Youth Services supports young people who give their time to others, to gain recognition through a range of awards. They also facilitate volunteer placements for those already registered on leadership awards.
