Key facts and stats

The Farr youth team has worked with over 60 youngsters aged between 11 and 21 amounting to 535 meaningful contacts

Around 279 hours in this period were spent engaging with young people.

These were delivered on over 94 separate occasions

And took place in Melvich, Bettyhill, Melness, Aviemore, Golspie, Dornoch and Eden Court in Inverness!

THE STORIES: THE DIFFERENCES: THE FUTURE

Melvich Megacaff

Melvich youngsters come together twice a week at the Megacaff for a variety of games, activities and learning opportunities. They have monthly trips out to the North Coast Leisure Centre where they get to meet up with other young people from Bettyhill, Tongue and Melness as well as enjoy a swim in the pool and a shot in the zorbs.

Strathnaver Museum Youth Project

Four S1/S2 pupils have been involved in future planning for our local museum working alongside Museum Manager Fiona MacKenzie in developing a tourist App which maps local areas and sights of interest. Funding has been secured to run a young volunteers project.

Rock Challenge

Eighteen pupils from P7 to S5 took part in the Be Your Best Rock Challenge event at Eden Court in April. This is a dance competition which gives young people the opportunity not only to learn dance and team work, but also sound editing, filming, lighting, costumes and props. It was the first ever entry from Farr. It increased self-confidence and shown youngsters that they can still achieve regardless of living remotely and coming from a small school.
