Key facts and stats

The Gairloch youth team worked with over 44 youngsters aged between 11 and 21 amounting to 199 meaningful contacts

In total there were 683 hours of engagement with young people

These were delivered on 16 separate occasions

Sessions took place in Gairloch High School and The Den Youth Club.

#### The Den Youth Club

The youth work team has been supporting the Den Youth club by bringing in new and exciting activities for the young people to engage with. Fusion events have been held at the Den and have increased the numbers of young people attending

#### **Gairloch Youth Forum**

A new youth forum is being developed and will see more members join over the coming year. School assemblies are planned by current members in order to inform the school community about membership of a local youth forum and the Highland Youth Parliament.

## Supporting young people in need

The youth service team has been working closely with Gairloch High School, Primary Heads and lead practitioners in identifying young people with particular needs and creating early intervention projects which will help these young people reach their full potential and gain recognised youth achievement awards.
