Key facts and stats

The youth work team has worked with over 50 young people: this amounted to 859 meaningful contacts.

In total there were approximately 2550 hours of engagement with young people

These occurred on 66 occasions and were delivered in Drumnadrochit and Cannich.

Strathglass Youth Club

This is our longest running youth club in the area. There is a lot of direct engagement from the parent committee which helps to co-ordinate the Senior youth club, along with the Junior club that they run themselves. After the village hall was remodelled in 2013 it has become a much more user friendly space for a variety of local groups to use, and with an increased number of young people in the area we hope his club will continue to grow in popularity for the young people to enjoy. The attendees are coming from an increasingly wider area and seem to enjoy the atmosphere in this established club.

Glen Urquhart Youth Club

Having suffered from large fluctuations in numbers over the last couple of years the Glen Urquhart Youth Club seems to have reached a point of stability. The young people who attend enjoy a wide range of activities each night, including access to the games hall and theatre facility in our community school. This club has been positively infused with young people travelling fair distances to attend. The young people and staff, new and old, all enjoy this interaction as it brings further community cohesion.
