### Key facts and stats

The youth team worked with over 89 young people aged between 11 and 21 amounting to 636 meaningful contacts.

In total there were approx 2,400 hours of engagement with young people.

These were delivered on 70 separate occasions.

And took place in the Craig MacLean Centre, Grantown Grammar School, Grantown YMCA and Grantown Service Point.

3 recognised awards were gained

## THE STORIES: THE DIFFERENCES: THE FUTURE

16+ Group

Pupils from Grantown Grammar participated in an eight week programme in partnership with SDS. The programme looked at a range of different topics from CV writing and interview skills to independent living and budgeting. Feedback from young people was positive with the young people reporting increased knowledge and career information as they look to leave school.

#### **FUSION EVENTS**

Fusion evenings were run in both Grantown YMCA and the Craig Maclean Centre in Grantown. Activities included bubble football and Lazertag. Events were well attended and gave an opportunity for youth workers to make new contact with the young people. Evaluation was encouraging as the young people stated that they had thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

#### **ACTIVITY AGREEMENTS**

The youth team worked with a small number of recent school leavers in order to help support them gain real life work experience and help develop interview skills and apply for college. It was pleasing to note that two young people made successful applications.
