#### Key facts and stats

Invergordon youth team has worked with over 150 youngsters aged between 11 and 21 amounting to 1640 meaningful contacts

In total there were 6383 hours of engagement with young people

These were delivered on 122 separate occasions

These took place in Joss Street Hall & Invergordon Academy

### THE STORIES: THE DIFFERENCES: THE FUTURE

#### **Invergordon Youth Club**

Youth club is held every Monday and Thursday night at Joss Street Hall between 7pm and 9pm.

Each night sees up to 30 young people between the ages of 12 and 18 come through the door to play pool, listen to music, play darts and hang out with friends.

Each week we try to do different activities such as baking, photography with iPad, graffiti art in the workshop along with different arts and crafts.

HLH/North Highland College Employability Programme

Now in its third year, 16 learners are working towards completing the PEP course based within Joss Street youth centre. The majority of participants have secured a work placement or an employment opportunity.

#### **Upcycle Invergordon Project**

In partnership with the Cromarty Firth Men's Shed and Birchwood Highland nine young learners have gained essential practical life skills to refurbish the disused garden workshop at Joss Street Hall. The combined forces of younger and older learners have upcycled a number of household items to help raise funds for the future.
