### Key facts and stats

The Plockton youth team worked with over 65 youngsters aged between 11 and 21 amounting to 360 meaningful contacts

In total there were 1713 hours of engagement with young people

These were delivered on 40 separate occasions

And took place in Plockton High School, Auchtertyre Learning Centre, Lochalsh Youth Club, Torrin outdoor centre, Local environment,

#### Lochalsh Youth Club

The youth service team has supported Lochalsh Youth Club during its normal operating hours as well as creating new opportunities for the young people which include Trips to Inverness, Trips to other youth clubs in the Highlands, Drumming workshops, DJ workshops, Art and craft sessions, and running Open Fusion events to encourage new membership.

#### Plockton Youth Forum

Plockton Youth forum currently has 18 active members, two of which sit on the Highland Youth Parliament executive committee. Plockton youth forum continues to bring empowerment to the whole school community buy engaging them in matters that affect young people living in the area.
