Key facts and stats

The Ullapool youth team has worked with about 106 young people aged between 12 and 25 amounting to 549 meaningful contacts

In total there were 1389 hours of engagement with young people

These were delivered on 85 separate occasions

And took place in Ullapool, Lochinver, Ross & Cromarty Youth Forum, Sutherland Youth Forum and Highland Youth Parliament

Summer Activities

Over the Summer there were various activities including cooking classes, art workshops, trips to paintball, Landmark and the cinema. We had a higher number of participants than the previous year and all went very well.

Ullapool Youth Forum

The new look youth forum has 16 new members and the group have been working on the youth space plans. They have done research around the school to see if there is still a need and did a talk in assembly about the plans

Activity Agreements

These are for young people 16-18 who are out of Education and not in Employment. We have 6 on AA at the moment and are working with partners to look at programmes around employment and confidence building to help this group progress to a positive destination

Health & Wellbeing

In Ullapool we have a local partnership which has organised a Community Taster day. The first one was in March and the next one is in November. The youth workers and young people give up a lot of time within this to help organise and plan the day, not just for other young people but for the whole community
