Key numbers for the period

The Ardnamurchan youth team has had 82 meaningful contacts with young people

In total there were 174 hours of engagement

All this was delivered on 43 separate occasions.

Projects

YDO Recruitment: Through engagement with Youth Work staff, young people in Ardnamurchan were actively involved in the recruitment of a new Youth Development Officer for the area. A small group met with existing staff to devise questions for interview and set out their ideas for what they hoped a new YDO would bring to the area.

Two local young people were part of the interview panel itself and were rewarded for their efforts by Highlife Highland.

<u>FUSION Food Event</u>: This year, Pancake Day coincided with our weekly Tuesday drop in session. What better way to celebrate than by making our own afternoon tea? Working in teams, the young people collaborated to source ingredients and follow a simple recipe to turn out plates of perfect pancakes!

Saltire Volunteering Awards: Working in partnership with colleagues from Highlife Highland's Active Schools team, Youth Development continues to support the work of our local young volunteers. Regular school assemblies to highlight these opportunities and drop-in sessions to help volunteers keep on top of the admin have been introduced. We look forward to continued success in this area!

- Will continue to have opportunities to develop personal and social skills and be actively recognised for any achievements
