

1935 Jan 1st – A Shinty Match was played at Oban, between Oban Celtic Shinty Club and the Glasgow Skye Camanach for the new trophy called “The Kaid MacLean Cup” the cup was presented by Mr William Macintosh, as a memorial to his friend Mr MacLean, both at one time well known “Shinty players” after a hard tussel the cup was won by the “Oban Celtic” who beat the Glasgow Skye, by 9 goals to one. In order to make sure the coveted trophy the Oban side had produced a picked team.

1935 Jan 1st – Portree – the advent of new year was heralded by the tingling of Steamer’s bells and, gay shouts of first footers on their rounds. Later in the day Religious services were held in the Presbyterian Churches. In the Episcopal Church (St Columba) divine service was conducted by Rev. Mr. Barbar - the first service to be held since last summer.

1935 Jan 2nd- Accidental death of William Fraser, Portree. Mr Fraser who was visiting friends at the Meall or Fancy Hill evidently slipped over the face of the cliff and was fatally injured. His body was discovered at the back of Quay Street..
