## Letter to The Depute Chief Constable, The Castle, Inverness from Inspector A. Chisholm, Fort William, 18th May 1911 (GB3218/R91/D/C/1/20)

Ascent of Bennevis [Ben Nevis] by Motor Car Constabulary Office Fort William, 18<sup>th</sup> May 1911

Sir,

I beg to report that a Motor Car, by Ford Motor Car Ltd Detroit, driven by Mr. Henry Alexander, of Messrs Alexander & Co., Edinburgh, ascended Bennevis [Ben Nevis] and yesterday a large company from London and Edinburgh [etc] ascended the Ben to view the car on the summit, and witness its descent, which was accomplished without any accident. The car returned to Fort William at 1.pm today. The shops were closed, and all business suspended for two hours. The return of the car was waited upon at the Alexandra Hotel.

The Territorial Pipe and Drum Band, the Town Council and general public turned out, and formed a procession through the town to Gordon Square, and back to Cameron Square where speeches were delivered – an immense crowd of people witnessed the return of the car.

I called in P.C.s Macdonald, Spean Bridge and Macdonald Onich for duty on this occasion. All passed over orderly and quietly, and P.C. Macdonald Spean Bridge returned to His Station at 4.30pm. and P.C. Macdonald Onich at 7. pm
