Inverness Royal Academy and Inverness Royal Infirmary have both been established in the town of Inverness for over 200 years. The funding for these historic institutions is well recorded, and the Clan Chattan names reoccur throughout the records.

UR Sovereign Lord confidering, That an humble petition has been presented to his Majesty by and on behalf of William Mackintosh Esq; Provost of the burgh of Inverness, John Mackintosh Esq; William Inglis Esq; Alexander Mackintosh Esq; and James Clark Esq; Bailies, and James Shaw Esq; Dean of Guild of the said burgh of Inverness; of Simon Fraser of Farraline Esq; his Majesty's Sheriff-depute of the county of Buncan Davidson of Inverness; and of Lachlan Macgillivray Esq; William Mackintosh Esq; Thomas Fraser Esq; Alexander Fraser Esq; and Anter of Newcastle Esq; gus Mackintosh Esq; being a committee chosen by the Commisfioners of Supply of the county of Inverness for superintending the management and direction of the affairs of the Academy Grant, late of Bengal



The Royal Warrant of 1793, seen above, which gave Inverness Academy its Royal Charter holds the names of the Directors of the Academy. The warrant includes the names of several Clan Chattan families who can also be found in the accounts for the Academy. Lachlan Mackintosh of Raigmore's subscription was used, at his request, to purchase medals for the most proficient students. The medal was inscribed "To the Royal Academy of Inverness from Lachlan Mackintosh Esquire of Raigmore in testimony of his zealous wish for its prosperity".

Winners of medals included Davidson and Mackintosh children.
