


A THEFT AT THE GOLD DIGGINGS

The Gold Rush year at Kildonan, although a prosperous period for the region, also saw its share of quarrels. One particular case highlights the greed and desperation which can be brought by gold.

Duncan Fraser, aged 45, was a storekeeper in Baile an Or in September of 1869. He made a complaint to Sergeant Ross that he had been the victim of a theft.



Mr Fraser kept two ounces of gold in a box, inside a coffee canister on a shelf in his shop. He had shown the gold to a traveller the day before and, since now it had disappeared, he suspected that this particular traveller, Robert Rider, a 41 year old Furrier from Birkenhead, had stolen his gold.



Robert Rider had resided in Kildonan for some time at the gold diggings and was in possession of a miner's license. He had not had much luck at the gold fields and had coincidentally left Kildonan the same day Mr Fraser discovered the disappearance of his gold. As Mr Fraser was eager to recover his gold and have the thief brought to justice, the police set out right away and managed to apprehend Mr Rider as he was leaving the area. He was taken to the local police station and searched, but the police found no gold in his possession. He was released, but Mr Fraser was not satisfied with this result. The suspect was searched again, and this time was asked to remove his boots. As he did so, a small package fell out of his boot which turned out to be a small nugget of gold, weighing two ounces.

On discovery of this, Mr Rider was arrested and we can follow his journey as a prisoner through the records.









A THEFT AT THE GOLD DIGGINGS

When the prisoner arrives in Dornoch, it is noted in the daily Occurrence Book of Sergeant Bridgeford of Dornoch Station.



The prisoner is processed at Dornoch station and his crime is entered in the Register of Parties Accused of Crimes and Offences, along with the fact he was prosecuted and the sentence he received which was 30 days imprisonment.
