Name of creators: Lieutenant Robert Kennedy

Administrative history: Compiled by Lieutenant Robert Kennedy, (1753-1818) and used by Thomas Sinclair in his book 'Caithness Events', published 1894.

Lieutenant Robert Kennedy, later Captain, is buried in Wick Churchyard and was in the 94<sup>th</sup> Regiment Scotch Brigade. Captain Kennedy died at Harland 28<sup>th</sup> February 1818, aged 65. Robert Kennedy married Emelia Taylor who died in 1834 aged 73; they lived together at Wester in Caithness. It was while they lived at Wester that he compiled the notes on the history of Caithness. They had 3 sons.
