
Calligraphy Class 1

PALAEOGRAPHY - The study of Historical Handwriting, and reading old handwriting.

CALLIGRAPHY - The art of writing beautifully, includes pretty and decorative writing.

These are two subjects you will encounter often in Archives. These worksheets will help to give you a better understanding of the kinds of handwriting you will encounter in old documents, and how calligraphy can help you understand them.



This is an extract from <u>C/P/566/67/3/11</u>—a record of a Business Account by John M. Nimmo Esq. Writer, Wick to David Forsyth S.S.C. Edinburgh. It was written in 1867.

As you can see the handwriting is quite clear, with some flourishes on certain letters.



Calligraphy is useful in reading old documents from Archives because copying the letters or words make it easier to guess what they are supposed to be.

Take this example from <u>P454/18</u>. It may be difficult to read at first as the parts of the letters are not joined together. But if you look at it and try copying the shapes of the letters, it makes it easier to see what it's supposed to read.



Next, we are going to practice copying out letters to get used to forming the different shapes and extra flourishes used in the first example of the Business Account, <u>C/P/566/67/3/11</u>.
