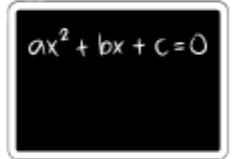

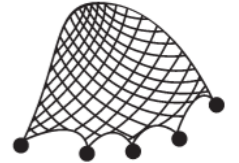

Crown 5s



Half crown 2½ s

The Victorian currency usually used pounds, shillings and pence. There were 20 shillings in one pound, and 12 pennies in one shilling. They were written like this:

£1 3s 4d = one pound, 3 shillings and fourpence

Either draw the coins or write out eleven pounds and eighty-three pence in old currency. This is a day's wage of a skilled tradesman.
