The Caithness and Sutherland Divisional Labour Party, now the Caithness, Sutherland and Ross Labour Party (2025) campaign for the Labour Party in

the north of Scotland.

Canisbay Branch of the Caithness and Sutherland Constituency Labour Party

Formed in 1924, Canisbay was the first branch in the constituency and possibly the only one North of Perth at that time.

Colin Mackay

Colin Mackay was the Labour Party Canisbay Branch Secretary for 11 years and was responsible for persuading some leading Government members to speak at the annual dinner. This was in the time that Robert MacLennan was the

Local MP (1966-2001).

The visits of the Labour Ministers took the form of appearances at local businesses and these feature in the press cuttings within the collection.

Latterly, Colin was one of the main supporters of the Arthur Yates Memorial Shield presented to the Thurso High School pupil showing most promise in Modern Studies.
