RECORDS' CONTEXT

Name of creators:	The Bell Family; Caithness Young Farmer's Club; Scottish Women's Rural Institute; Dounreay; Wick Academy FC; various
Administrative history:	<p><u>The Bell Family</u> Robert Shearer Bell was born in 1949 in Thurso. He attended Thurso Technical College as part of his education and completed an apprenticeship with Dounreay/ UKAEA.</p> <p>In 1977, Robert married Linda Margaret Bannerman (born 1952 in Inverness) at a service held in Reay.</p> <p>They had two children; Robert and Alisanne Bell.</p> <p><u>Young Farmers' Club (YFC)</u> The first Young Farmers' Club (YFC) opened in 1921 in Hemyock, Devon, where the United Dairies milk factory tasked the children of the area's milk producers to compete in calf rearing, with competitions and prizes for those children who achieved the highest standards.</p> <p>After the death of Lord Northcliffe, one of the Young Farmers' Clubs (YFC) original founders, the Ministry of Agriculture in 1922 stepped in and took over but this was relatively short lived, with the</p>

National Council for Social Services (NCSS) taking control in 1929 and developing the YFC as a voluntary, self-governing and self-generating organisation. By March 1932, The National Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs, was formed, with its head office in London.

Scottish Women's Rural Institute

The very first Women's Institute was started on the 19th February 1897 at Stoney Creek, Ontario, Canada. It was an advance on the 'Onward and Outward Association' started in Scotland by Lady Aberdeen, whose aim it was to 'enable country girls to meet regularly at pre-arranged venues, to enjoy evenings of varied programmes conducted by a voluntary organiser.'

The first Scottish Women's Rural Institute (or S.W.R.I.) to be formed in Caithness was in Keiss in July 1918, with a Miss Adelaide Bay Robertson of Keiss Castle being instrumental in its inauguration, however, it is the Dunnet branch (starting in November 1918) that is considered to be the oldest WRI branch in Caithness due to continuity, as Keiss closed for a number of years.

Dounreay

The UK Atomic Energy Authority (UKAEA) was formed in 1954 when the British Government set up a new body to oversee the nation's nuclear research programme. The role was to provide Britain's atomic weapons deterrent and develop reactor technologies for the nuclear power stations of the future.

Early achievements included the Dounreay Fast Reactor, which went critical in 1959.

The civil nuclear programme ended with the closure of the Prototype Fast Reactor at Dounreay in 1994.

In April 2005 the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) was formed to take responsibility for the UK's civil nuclear clean-up programme.

UKAEA became a contractor to the NDA for management of decommissioning at Dounreay, Harwell, Windscale, Winfrith and the JET facilities at Culham.

In April 2008, UKAEA Limited was formed as a commercial arm, subsidiary company Dounreay Site Restoration Limited (DSRL) was licensed by the NII, and the Windscale site was merged into the newly licensed Sellafield Limited.

Following a sale process announced by Government in March 2009, UKAEA Limited, together with its subsidiary companies DSRL and RSRL, were sold to Babcock International Group PLC on 31st October 2009. The remaining UKAEA organisation then focused on fusion energy research at Culham.

Wick Academy FC

Wick Academy Football Club was founded in October 1893, taking its name from the cricket club which had been in existence for about 20 years.

The club was known in Wick simply as Academy and sometimes in other parts of Caithness as Pulteneytown Academy. An indirect and unofficial connection with the local school of the same name was maintained with the election of a teacher, John Davidson, as the first captain or 'leader' as it was termed in the minute book of the first meeting. The club's first game was a friendly away to Castletown. Home games were played at Harrow Park, now known as Harmsworth Park. Ten matches, with only two defeats, were played in that first season against teams like Thurso Thistle, Wick Thistle, John o' Groat FC, Lybster Portland and Dunbeath.

A Caithness County League was started in 1926/7 by which time the Harmsworth family had bought the park and gifted it to the town with the Burgh Council as trustees and local sports clubs forming a management committee. Football clubs began ground improvements and built a stone wall to enclose the park.

As the only SFA club in Caithness

(Thurso Pentland were also members for 3 years from 1936), Academy were allowed to sign players of other clubs to play in Qualifying Cup games. From 1928 onwards they were unbeaten at home in Qualifying Cup ties.

In 1960 the Caithness Amateur Football Association switched to summer football and to retain its SFA membership Wick Academy had to stay with the normal winter season playing only cup ties and friendlies for the next 12 years.

In 1972, with Clair Harper as chairman, the club joined the North of Scotland 2nd XI Association.

After having several applications refused, Wick Academy were at last voted into the Highland League in 1994 when Caledonian and Inverness Thistle amalgamated and left to join the Scottish Football League along with Ross County.

The club continues to play in The Highland Football League at the time of writing (2025).
