

High Life Highland Guest Wi-Fi Acceptable Use Policy

High Life Highland (HLH) is pleased to offer Wi-Fi access to its members and visitors (hereinafter referred to as users). Access to Wi-Fi is offered on condition that users agree to abide by this Wi-Fi Acceptable Use Policy.

Terms of Use

- The use of the Wi-Fi service is a privilege and not a right, which may be taken away if abused.
- Child level internet filtering applies to the Wi-Fi service. Adult users who do find legitimate sites blocked are advised to use the Public Access computers which can be found in a number of HLH buildings - mainly in public and community libraries.
- Parents and guardians of minors are responsible for setting and conveying the standards that their children should follow when using media and information sources.
- Passwords should be held as private information and not disclosed to anyone else.
- The user acknowledges that the internet is not a secure environment, and that disclosure of personal information on-line, including bank details, is at the user's own risk. High Life Highland accepts no responsibility for the consequences of any such transmission of information. Users should not utilise the Wi-Fi service to submit, publish, display, download, copy or transmit any information which:
 - a. is illegal because it violates copyright laws, Data Protection Act, Computer Misuse Act or any other relevant legislation
 - b. is harmful to any other person
 - c. encourages illegal behaviour
- Users must not attempt to store, produce, copy, access or display material which may be considered to be offensive. This may include text or images of a sexual, pornographic, obscene, defamatory, libellous nature, or which promotes violence, contains hate speech or any material of an illegal nature, or likely to cause distress or offence to others.
