The premises are shared with a service point. The building has been adapted at ground level, with the main public entrance accessed via a long front passage and a side entrance for disabled access and deliveries. The main library underwent refurbishment in 2006.

Accessibility

Car parking:

Parking is available on High Street directly outside the library.

Public transport:

There are frequent bus services with stops located nearby. The railway station is approximately a 5-minute walk from the library.

Additional information

Accessible entry is available via the side door, added in May 2009. Both front and rear entrances are equipped with semi-automatic push pads. There is one designated disabled parking bay at the front entrance. An induction loop system is provided for hearing aid users.
