## Accommodation

Inverness Public Library occupies a historic building originally constructed as Bell's Institution, a school, in 1841. After closing as a school in 1937, the building served as a courthouse, police station, and theatre before becoming a public library in 1980. Today, visitors can access the lending library, co-working hub, and reference room. The library also hosts regular activities, exhibitions, and author events.

### **Car Parking:**

The library is next to the Rose Street multi-storey car park. Accessible parking spaces are available at the front entrance of the library.

The library is located next to the bus station and railway station. Local bus services can be reached from the town centre, which is about a 5-minute walk away.

### **Additional information**

The library provides one public computer equipped with accessibility features to support users with visual impairments.
