



Bonfire Night and Fireworks - 5 November 2022

Q) Is the Bonfire and Fireworks event free?

A) Yes, the event is free and no tickets are required for entry.

Q) Do I need a ticket?

A) No, this event does not require a ticket for entry.

Q) How long does it last?

A) The venue at Bught Park opens at 5pm, where there will be food vendors on site and a funfair. The bonfire will be lit at 5.45pm and the Fireworks Display starts at 6.30pm. The event closes at 7pm.

Q) What should I wear?

A) Please dress appropriately for the weather. Wear warm clothing and footwear suitable for areas where there may be uneven ground. As this event takes place in the evening, it will be dark and colder.

Q) When I get into the venue at Bught Park can I just wander anywhere?

A) Please stay in the areas marked for safe viewing and follow the instructions of the safety announcer and stewards on site. In particular, note that access to the immediate area around the bonfire and firework display is restricted to event staff only. This area will be clearly marked on site and stewards will be on duty at the entry and exit points.



Q) Can I bring a pushchair?

A) Yes, there is ample space for pushchairs and buggies.

Q) How can I get there and where can I park?

A) Visitors are advised to 'park and walk' or 'park and ride' in order to attend the display. Limited parking will be available at Torvean car park and public buses also serve the area – please check with Stagecoach for an up to date timetable. Parking for the event is restricted due to temporary road closures in place at Bught Road and Bught Drive. Visitors are asked to respect those who live in the area and are urged not to park in the residential areas near to the venue.

Q) Is there parking for Blue Badge holders?

A) If you have any special requirements or mobility issues, please contact info@highlifehighland.com by 2pm on Friday 4 November. Parking for Blue Badge holders is available at Bught Stadium: follow the signs for Torvean Avenue to the Blue Badge parking area.

Q) Can I get something to eat when I'm at the event?

A) There will be five food vendors on site serving food and light refreshments from 5pm. They include Redshank, The Treat Truck, Ness Highland Catering, Ollies Pops and Heilan Brew, who will be offering food and non alcoholic refreshments (hot and cold).

Q) What COVID related restrictions do I need to adhere to?

A) Face coverings when indoors or outdoors are optional.

Q) Would you cancel the event if there is bad weather?

A) High Life Highland reserve the right to cancel the event if circumstances arise that are beyond our control. This includes bad weather. If this happens, we will do everything we reasonably can to let inform people intending to travel to the event.



Q) Can I bring my own fireworks, like sparklers, to the event?

A) No. For safety reasons, **no** flammable objects or liquids are allowed to be brought into the event area. Stewards will be instructed to remove any such objects if displayed.

Q) Can I smoke cigarettes or similar at the event?

A) Please do not light cigarettes or similar near the Bonfire or Firework Display areas. You will be asked to extinguish any objects with a naked flame.

Q) Can I consume alcohol at the event?

A) No alcohol will be permitted within the event area. The event is not licensed and stewards have been instructed to remove alcohol.

Q) Can I bring my pet to the event?

A) No, all pets should be left at home. Fireworks can be highly disturbing for animals.
